Club Repeaters

- 2 meters - VK4RDB FM Repeater transmits on 146.875 MHz from Mt Cotton.
- 70 cm - VK4RDB FM/DV Repeater transmits on 439.725 MHz from Mt Cotton it has Echolink and IRLP Node 6633 is available. This is a Yaesu Digital repeater and can be used in either FM or Digital mode.
- 70 cm - VK4RDB DV Repeater transmits on 438.825 MHz DMR primary mode Brandmeister & FreeDMR, D-Star secondary mode.
